Winter Overnight Shelter Susquehanna Harbor Safe Haven

This winter we are committed to staff the week of February 16 to February 22, 2020. Two Volunteers are needed per night, one of whom must be male. The hours are 7:30pm to 7:00am. All we have to do is make coffee, set out snacks, be available during the night, (you can go to sleep in a separate room), and get the guests out the door in the morning. Staff is available in the residential facility next door if needed.

A Partnership Between Water Street Mission, LifePath Christian Ministries & Bethesda Mission November 3 - December 20th



The hymn of the day for November 12 is ELW 436, Wake, Awake for Night is Flying. The text and tune are by Philipp Nicolai. This piece is the "King" of the chorales. Many composers have written choral pieces on it. Wake, Awake has many associations with Advent and it was in that section in the Lutheran Book of Worship. In the ELW it has moved to the End Time section. This text has Advent themes as well as communion themes. The last verse has "end times" themes as well. Like I say read the hymn verses as you prepare for worship. The words in verse one "the feast to share" and verse two "follow to the banquet hall" all speak of communion. Verse three speaks of "leading us to bliss beyond all dreaming with angel choirs around your throne." This speaks to me of the end times.

THOMAS GAYNOR

First Evangelical Lutheran Church, 21 S. Bedford St., Carlisle Sunday, November 17th at 3:00 p.m.

Thomas Gaynor is a New Zealand born organist. In 2017, he was awarded the First Prize in Organ interpretation as well as the Audience Prize at the St. Albans International Organ Competition the 25th organist and the second New Zealander to receive this distinction since the competition and festival was founded in 1963. He is rapidly making his mark on the organ scene in both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres with rock-solid playing and remarkable musical élan. Mr. Gaynor is a doctoral candidate at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York, and a recipient of Eastman's highly coveted Artist Diploma, an honor the institution had not given an organist for nearly three decades. The recital will showcase the majesty and versatility of the church's 1951 Aeolian-Skinner pipe organ, regarded as one of the finest instruments in South Central Pennsylvania. The concert will be held as a benefit for The Arc of **Cumberland and Perry Counties** (www.CPARC.org). Based in Carlisle, its mission is to provide
